National Cadet Corps (NCC) is Asia's largest uniformed Youth Organization and the youth wing of the Indian Armed Forces with its headquarters in New Delhi, India. It is open to school and college students on voluntary basis as a Tri-Services Organization comprising of the Army, Navy and Air Wing engaged in grooming the youth of the country into disciplined and patriotic citizens. The Cadets are given basic military training in small arms and drill. The Officers and Cadets have no liability for active military Service once they complete their course.















NCC was introduced at Vivekananda College in the year 2007 under 20 Bengal Battalion (Army Wing). Since then, Lt. Dr. Trijit Nanda had served as the ANO of the college NCC unit till 17th April, 2023. Now, Prof Nabankur Roy has taken charge as the CTO of the unit w.e.f 18th April, 2023. Every year cadets pass the 'B' certificate and 'C' certificate exam. They perform different awareness programmes like "Swachchata hi Seva", literacy drives and observe National Days like Independence Day, Republic Day, Netaji's Birthday with pomp and glory every year. They also actively participate in different camps organised by the battalion which helps them to develop character, comradeship, discipline, secular outlook, spirit of adventure and Ideals of selfless service. A number of Combined Annual Training Camps have been successfully organised in our college premises till date.
