Disaster Relief Efforts:

- Cyclone Bulbul Relief (2019): The college took significant steps to provide relief to those affected by Cyclone Bulbul in June 2019. Cyclone Bulbul Relief Efforts. Cyclone Bulbul, which struck the coastal regions of West Bengal in November 2019, caused widespread devastation, leaving many communities in dire need of assistance. Recognizing the urgent need for aid, Vivekananda College, Thakurpukur, mobilized its resources to extend relief services to the affected areas.

- Yaas Cyclone (2021): Following Cyclone Yaas in 2021, Vivekananda College once again stepped up. On June 7th, they provided lunch to 1250 people in the Raidighi Block of Sundarbans. The college acknowledges the valuable assistance received from local authorities, including Sri Buddhadeb Halder, Sri Jaybhusan Bhandari, and the Panchyat Pradhan of Nagendrapur, in ensuring the success of this initiative.

Relief Distribution:

Essential Supplies: The college organized the collection and distribution of essential supplies, including food, water, clothing, and medical kits, to the affected communities. These supplies were crucial in addressing the immediate needs of the people who had lost their homes and belongings to the cyclone.

Volunteer Efforts: A team of dedicated volunteers, comprising students, faculty, and staff, traveled to the affected areas to distribute the relief materials. Their efforts ensured that the aid reached the most vulnerable sections of the population efficiently and effectively.
